

Statement of Evidence:

The Northeast Corner of Section 19, Township 36 North, Range 28 West, Glendorado Township, 4th Principal Meridian, Benton County, Minnesota.

1855 Original US General Land Office survey set a wood post at this location and bearing trees were recorded.

16" White Oak	N 33 W	35 links
16" Poplar	N 22 1/2 E	53 links

1914 County Surveyor's Record Book 1, page 41, and Record Book A, Map No. 2 contains a survey of Section 17 by J.P. Soderstrum. He found an oak stake driven in centerline of new grading for road. Two large oak stumps checking the reverse of the Gov't notes. Tree called for N 22 1/2 E 53 links was N 22 1/2 W 53 links.

1915 County Surveyor's Record Book 1, page 45 and 46, shows J.P. Soderstrum did a survey of Section 19. At the corner he found a wood stake in centerline of road set by Parent in 1889 and is claimed to be the old Government location by residents. Took new ties:

12" Elm	S 86 W	23 links
14" Elm	N 1-05 E	65 links

1926 County Engineers' notebook 44, page 74, notes wood stake with ties:

14" Elm	N 1-05 E	43.3'
F. P.	NE	48.0'

No Date County Highway Department notes show stake with pointed rock on top with the following ties:

14" Elm	North	42.6
T.P.	NW	92.6

2002 On November 7, 2002 Westwood Professional Services, Inc. dug with a backhoe in center of roads east-west and south. A 8'X 8' hole was excavated and down 5.5 feet found a 1'x 1'x 2' tall pointed rock, which was lying on its side, near the intersection of the centerlines from the south and east. We also found many field stones and wood scraps in the hole, but we did not find the stake that the rock was supposed to be sitting on top of. We accepted the stone as a perpetuated position of the original corner. We set a spike at the surface above the location of the found rock and established ties.
