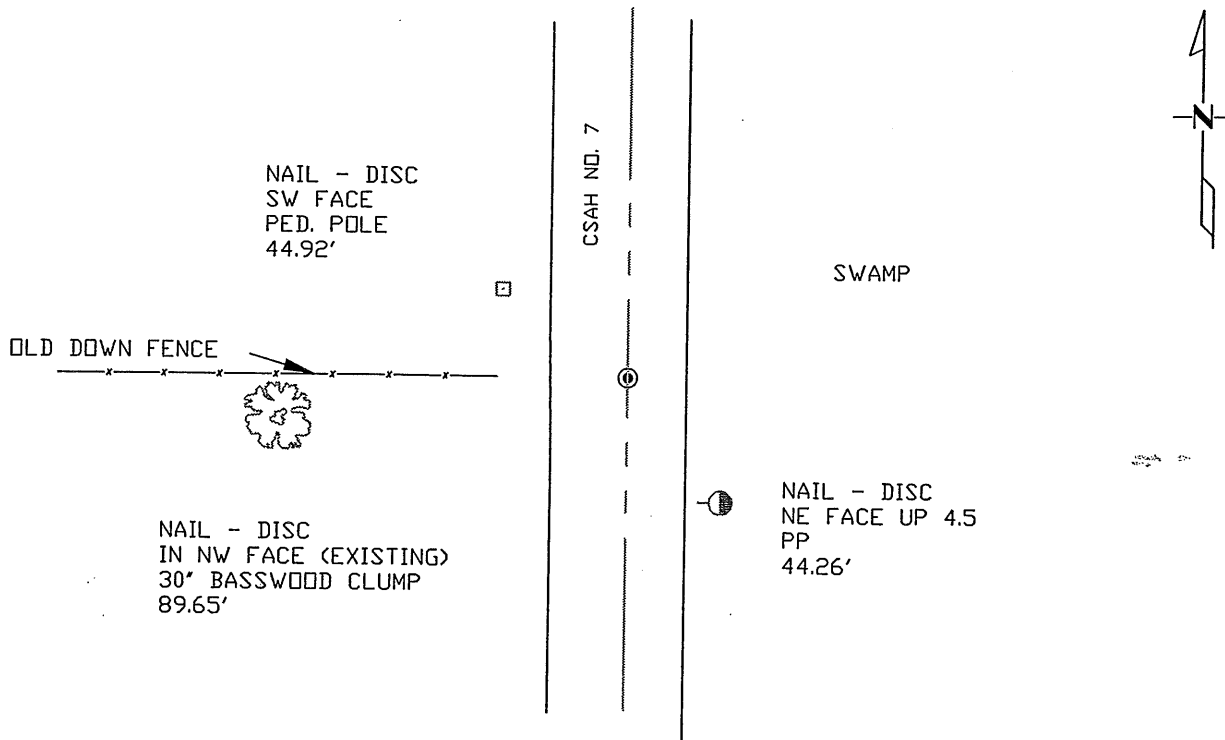

Statement of Evidence:

The East Quarter Corner of Section 21, Township 38 North, Range 28 West, Granite Ledge Township, 4th Principal Meridian, Benton County, Minnesota.

In 1855, Oscar F. Davis set a wood post at this location and bearing trees were recorded.

8" Elm	S 2 1/2 W	12 links
6" B. Ash	N 17 E	17 links

The County Surveyors records in Book 2, page 350 show an iron over a wood post, (wood post found on 6-24-60) with the following reference ties dated 1963.

P.P.	SE	46.25
T.P.	SW	33.1
12" Basswood	SW	88.95

Undated and unspecific notes state that the corner has the following reference ties.

P.P.	SE	46.9
T.P.	SW	33.0
12" Basswood	SW	88.8

on fence line running east and west

In September of 2000 David Regan notes a set iron pipe/RR spike in the centerline of north-south road.

On November 30, 2001 Westwood Professional Services, Inc. found a 1/2" iron pipe with a busted cap at the centerline of County Road 7 (running north and south). The iron pipe fits the 1963 tie to the Basswood and is in line with old down fence running west. Accepted corner as marking the same position as found wood post in 1960. Removed 1/2" iron monument and placed cast iron monument at the location and established reference ties.
